



Tribal Board Nomination Results

At the Tribal Board of Directors request, the accounting firm of Wicks Emmett, LLP will have oversight of the Tribal Election Process. Ballot packets, including instructions, will be mailed out to registered voters of the Tribe from Wicks Emmett, LLP no later than Thursday, July 11, 2013. If you are an eligible

voter and did not receive a ballot, you must contact the Tribal Office at 1-800-929-8229 or 1-541-672-9405. Ballots are to be returned directly to the Cow Creek Elections Committee c/o Wicks Emmett, LLP at PMB # 6B, Roseburg, OR 97470 and must be received by the accounting firm no later than 4:00 p.m. Friday, August 9, 2013.

The Annual Election Meeting will be held at 10:00 a.m. on Sunday, August 11, 2013, at the Cow Creek Tribal Government Offices, 2371 NE Stephens Street, Suite 100, Roseburg, OR 97470.



Canyonville Health and Wellness Center is Open



ness Center - South Campus, located on Wartahoo directly behind Seven Feathers Casino Resort, opened to provide healthcare service on Monday, May 20.

The facility will be open Monday - Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 5 p.m. The Cow Creek Health and Wellness Center in Roseburg, the North Campus, will continue to operate but the Health Annex in Canyonville will close.

Beautiful is one of many words that describes our new healthcare facility. Beyond the building's appearance, however, are the expanded capabilities housed in the facility. We've made the check-in process much easier. There is no extra paperwork and that means your wait to be seen is as short as possible. We are staffed with full medical capabilities and a dietitian. Our new facility has an X-ray department and expanded lab services. Lifestyle Education & Exercise classes - both individual and group classes are also available to those that want that service. Additionally, the behavioral health department has a counselor and case manager on site every day.

The Cow Creek Health and Wellness - South Campus was built to provide healthcare to all Tribal members. If you aren't currently using the clinic, please call and get a New Patient Packet sent to your home or stop in and get one. Completing the packet before you need services will save you time.

Later this summer, we'll celebrate the expansion of the Tribe's healthcare services at a Grand Opening!

The weather has been nicer causing the need for urgent care visits. If members have not complied with the eligibility requirements the claim cannot be processed as it normally would. CHS is here to help the members, but we need your help with updating eligibility and insurance.

If you start a new insurance contact CHS with this information or if you term from an insurance plan contact CHS with the term date. This will allow us to process your claims faster and more accurately.

Call 2-3 days in advance for purchase orders. This will keep you from being frantic if CHS is in training or a staff meeting.

Nesika Health Group New Plan Year

The Nesika Health Group announces changes to the health plan that will become effective in the coming year.

The Nesika Health Group currently operates on a "Plan Year" which is the same as the "Calendar Year" of January 1 - Dec 31. However, the "Plan Year" will be changing and will now be July 1, 2013 to June 30, 2014.

In order to make this transition as smooth as possible, the following will occur:

- Deductible: The deductible of \$500 that began on January 1, 2013 will continue until June 30, 2014. Then beginning on July 1, 2014, the deductible will start over.
- Out of Pocket: The total "Out-of-Pocket" of \$2,500 that began on January 1, 2013 will continue until June 30, 2014. The new "Out-of-Pocket" will then begin on July 1, 2014.
- Dental: You will have \$1,500 in benefits available for dental coverage from January 1, 2013 until June 30, 2014.
- All other benefits that are based on the "Plan Year" will accumulate from January 1, 2013 to June 30, 2014.
- Open Enrollment: Open enrollment will now be during the month of June, each year, instead of in December.



Tribal Knowledge Exchange Meeting with African Wildlife Leaders



Medford, OR: Meeting a group of people from nine different African countries who manage Elephants, Rhinos and so many other African species seems like an exotic experience that doesn't happen often, but for part of the Natural Resource Department this is exactly what they got to do on May 6.

The Natural Resource Director (Amy Amoroso), Environmental Specialist (Heather Bartlett), Fisheries Biologist (Kelly Coates) and Wildlife Specialist (Scott Van Norman) were invited to present to the World Affairs Council of Oregon International Visitors Leadership Program. The program has visitors from all around the world and is dedicated to connecting Oregon communities with international leaders from a wide variety of career fields.

The focus of the meeting was on wildlife conservation on tribal lands and how the Tribe interacts with both State and Federal governments. Each of the Natural Resource Department staff had the opportunity to speak to the group about the projects they work on and in re-

turn the African leaders had the chance to ask questions of them. The questions ranged from who is your leader? Why do we have fences? How do we keep track of our grants and stay accountable for them? And some puzzled looks on what a Lamprey looks like.

Afterwards we had the chance to talk one on one with individuals who wanted more information on specifics of what we did. Two people from South Africa and Zimbabwe were interested in the equipment that the Tribe purchased for water quality testing and wanted to know where they could purchase one themselves. Having the opportunity to share our knowledge with people who lived halfway around the world was both rewarding and eye opening. Reward Offered in Vandalism Case of South Umpqua Falls Campground





ROSEBURG, Ore. – A \$1,500 reward is being offered by the Umpqua National Forest and the Cow Creek Band of Umpqua Tribe of Indians in hopes that it will lead to the arrest and prosecution of those responsible for vandalism to the South Umpqua Falls Campground. Any tips can be reported to Forest Service Law Enforcement Office at (541) 496-4187. All tips will remain confidential.

The vandalism was discovered on Sunday, April 14th. The campground, located on the Tiller District of the Umpqua National Forest, will remain closed off to visitors.

The most severe of the vandalism was damage done to a meadow on the campground. "It appears a full-size truck came in and tore up the meadows in the campground, which are still wet this time of year. It is an unfortunate mess right now," said Donna Owens, District Ranger. "We have decided to close the campground temporarily in hopes the area will heal. Meadows are fragile and we must do some restoration before we reopen the site."

The damage comes at a critical time for the Umpqua National Forest. Faced with tighter budgets and fewer employees, the forest must carefully implement a plan to restore the campground while minimally inconveniencing visitors. "The South Umpqua Falls Campground is one of our most popular recreation sites. Families from Douglas County and beyond come spend time here," said Dave Erwin, Recreation Manager on the Tiller District. He added, "We have to be very careful about how we spend our recreation money. Because our limited funds will be spent repairing the vandalism, plans to refurbish picnic tables at the campground will be scrapped."

Recreation staff on the forest will work diligently to have the campground operational before the busy summer season. Owens said, "It's a shame the campground will be closed on these beautiful spring days we've been having. We plan to open the site by Memorial Day weekend."

The South Umpqua Falls Campground is closed until further notice. In the meantime, visitors to the Umpqua National Forest can plan visits to the Three C Rock, Ash Flat and Skillet Creek campgrounds. News From Natural Resource and Cultural Departments

Hello, Tribal members! The Natural Resources Department at 541-677-5575, or Nicole Wood, our Tribal Workforce hopes that you are enjoying the beautiful Spring, and apparently, early Summer weather we have had. There are several things that we have to report this month, and numerous goings on in the Tribal community.

First, the Tribal Garden is proud to announce that it now has two new workers! One of them, Joshua, brings years of gardening experience to the role. Another worker, Leevi, is a Tribal member, and will be starting shortly. Kenneth Grizzle, our Tribal Gardener, reports that the Garden "is coming along. We have been planting lettuce, cabbage, broccoli, cauliflower, Swiss chard, and potatoes. The strawberries are blooming, along with the blueberries, and the Marion berries. We have are irrigation up and running, and are very busy planting starts for a bountiful garden of produce. "

The Gardens are in need of volunteers, however, and extra hands are always appreciated. Drumming classes are being offered June 8th and 22nd, from 12-4 p.m. at the Block House in Canyonville. Both classes are potlucks, so bring a favorite dish to share! Elders' Bead classes are being offered May 16th, June 6th and 20th, from 1-4 p.m. in the Boardroom in the North Government Office.
