


The Education and Workforce Center is almost finished! We plan to be up and operational November 3rd. The Center will be open daily for youth, grades 6-12, from 2:30 – 6:00 pm (1:30 on Wednesdays). The afternoons will offer a light healthy meal; youth centered activities, access to a fully functioning computer lab for homework and social networking, mentoring, skill building oppor-

tunities, and provide a safe, fun place to hang out after school. Tutoring services will be provided by Umpqua Community College. The Center will be open for adults Tuesday-Thursday 10:00-2:00 and by appointment Monday and Friday. Adults can access the Center to use the computer lab, search for jobs, get assistance with resumes, prepare for GED testing, work with the national recognized Core Skill Mastery and Career Readiness programs, receive job coaching, plus much more! Various workshops will be offered in person and online throughout the day to assist with career development and skill building.

Each month the cultural educator will be sharing a new theme, with educational information and related activities. Takelma language courses and materials will be available. We will be hosting family learning and early literacy activities, assistance with college applications, FAFSA, scholarship, and counseling. Our prevention specialist will be onsite offering various lessons weekly. In November, we will kick off our first Digital Storytelling workshop. Digital storytelling is a process by which people share their life story and creative imaginings with others using technology and digital media.

#### **Contract Health News**

The 2015 applications will be in the mail by the first week in November. It is very important to fill them out and return them to PRC/CHS by December 31, 2014 or you will have no coverage. If you fail to get it in or lose your application you will have to go on line to cowcreek.com, choose the Contract Health Tab and print one out. If you don't have insurance, you must apply for OHP or provide pay stubs that show you make too much money to qualify for OHP with your PRC/CHS application.

Purchase orders need to be called in 2-3 days before your appointment. Know the name of the provider and the office name when calling in and give both your first and last name and if your child's last name is different please let us know as it is hard to remember all the names. It is important that PRC/CHS has the name right when the claim comes in if PRC/CHS is to pay. If you reschedule an appointment or can't make it call PRC/CHS and cancel that PO#. After six months calling vendors to see why a PO# is still open only to be told it was a no show or was rescheduled is very time consuming.

Purchase orders can be issued through December 31, 2014 but can't be issued into 2015 until after PRC/CHS updates the system on January 2, 2015.

PRC/CHS would like to thank the tribal members for helping to make this a great year and look forward to the New Year to come.







#### Hunting in dry weather? Here are five tips to increase your success.

- 1. Slow down. Wear something on your feet that will allow you to feel the dry sticks and twigs that are going to make noise when you step on them. You will not be able to cover as much ground, but you will get a better look at the animals you do see.
- 2. Plan to be at your destination early in the morning and late in the evening. When you get there, slow down or sit and use your optics to find deer.
- 3. Hunt areas where you can sit and glass, then develop a stalk that will get you within range without getting so close that all the noise you make getting there doesn't spook the quarry.
- 4. Consider drives (mainly for deer). No need to be quiet here. Generally speaking, the noisier the better when it comes to drives.
- Hunt from a stand, either tree or ground, and minimize walking.

#### **Pumpkin Wheat Honey Muffins**



1  $\frac{1}{2}$  c. whole wheat flour  $\frac{1}{2}$  tsp. baking soda

½ c. packed brown sugar
½ tsp. salt
1 tsp. pumpkin pie spice
⅔ c. canned pumpkin puree
½ c. honey

½ c. vegetable oil ½ c. chopped walnuts

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Grease a 12 cup muffin pan or line with paper liners. Place the raisins in a cup and add enough hot water to cover. Let stand for a few minutes to plump
- 2. In a large bowl, stir together flour, sugar, spice, baking powder, baking soda and salt. Make a well in the center, and put in eggs, pumpkin puree, oil and honey. Mix just until the dry ingredients are absorbed. Drain excess water from raisins, and stir in along with the walnuts. Spoon into muffin cups so they are about 2/3 full.
- 3. Bake for 18 minutes or until the tops spring back when lightly touched. Cool in the pan before removing from cups.

#### **Attention: New Medicare Part B Requirements**

The end of the year is near. Members will be sending in for their annual reimbursements and monthly payment plans for 2014-2015. To speed up the process, get your Medicare Savings Programs application in. We have found there are multiple new Medicare options available for payment assistance through Medicare Savings Programs. These options will assist our Tribe with some of the many medical expenses.

It is now a requirement that all Tribal members, spouses and disabled apply for this state benefit.

There are four kinds of Medicare Savings Programs. If you have income from working, you may qualify for one of these programs even if your income is higher than the income limits.

- Qualified Medicare Beneficiaries (QMBs)
   States must pay all Medicare cost-sharing for Medicare beneficiaries with incomes up to 100% Federal Poverty Level (FPL).
- Specified low-income Medicare Beneficiaries. (SLMBs)
   States must pay the Medicare Part B premium for Medicare beneficiaries with incomes between 100% FPL and 120% FPL.
- 3. Qualified Individual (QI)
  States have a limited amount of money from which they must pay, on a first come first serve basis, the Medicare Part B premium for Medicare beneficiaries with incomes between 120% FPL and 135 % FPL
- 4. Qualified Disabled and Working Individual (QDWI)
  States must pay the Medicare Part A premium for certain working disabled Medicare beneficiaries who have exhausted their entitlement to premium-free Part A benefits.

To apply for any of the above programs call your State Medicaid Program or go to your local Department of Human Services for assistance. You can also get more information online at Medicare.gov.



#### **Tribal Down Payment and Repair Assistance Program**

This program is not limited to the seven county service area and is designed to assist Cow Creek Tribal Members with either down payment and or closing cost towards the purchase of a home or for the repairs on an existing home (funding may not be used to buy a 5<sup>th</sup> Wheel, Trailer or RV). The combined maximum amount of money available for

each Tribal member through this program is \$5,000.00. If the homeowner sells the residence within a 5 year time frame, they are obligated to repay a prorated amount unless using equity as a rollover to purchase a new home. Tribal Members may apply for this program every 10 years as long as they do not owe money to any other Tribal Program. If you have used your \$3,500.00 you might be eligible to use the other \$1,500.00 if you are in your 10 year obligation period.

#### **Energy Assistance Application Deadlines**

Tribal Elders will be served first during the month of November for our LIHEAP program. Beginning December 1st we will serve the general tribal membership.



Policy & procedures include the following:

- Clients can only use this program once in a 12 month period.
- If you live outside the seven county service area you must first apply with the agency that administers the program in your area.
- If you have already used energy assistance funds from another agency you will not qualify again for 12 months.

#### Changes to expect:

You may qualify for a different reimbursement amount this year due to policy and procedure changes. Depending on your individual situation, it could be more or less than before.

#### **Portland Zoo Elder's Trip**

Our Elders had a great time at the Zoo in Sept. We arrived at lunch time gathered at the Zoo's Cascade Grill Café and enjoyed a lunch together. Everyone took a buddy with them and spent about 4 hours walking all around the zoo. The zoomers are like a mini tram that can pick you up anytime you needed a ride, and they zoom you all around the zoo. This is really nice and was really handy if you were ready for a break from walking. Also, available is renting electric scooters similar to Walmart's scooters so you could have your own personal transportation.

We all enjoyed many animals such as the Lions, Monkeys, Elephants and the Bald Eagles. The Lions were fascinating. A zoo keeper told our group they had 3 babies last year. A week ago the couple had given birth to 3 more little cubs. The father stays with the 1 year old cubs while the Mom is taken to feed the young ones.



We also learned that it can take 2-5 years for the male mane to mature completely. This male is 5 years old now, and his mane has darkened to a brownish-black color. #### **Tobacco Prevention Grant**



The Tobacco Prevention and Education Program (TPEP) will be absorbed, immediately, by the Cow Creek Behavioral Health staff and the point of contact will be the Cow Creek Prevention Coordinator, Michael Martinez.

The grant focuses primarily on the Environmental Approach to prevention and it will have us litigating the cause of smoke-free campuses and we will also analyze retail availability of to-bacco products which specifically target youth through product placement at local stores. It has been discussed that we would like to implement tobacco cessation services here at Cow Creek Behavioral Health. We have been tasked to research an Evidence Based Practice/Best

Practice around this service and be trained in it. We are not allowed to utilize tobacco prevention dollars for such a program, since the focus of the grant is on prevention and not intervention so other finances will have to be utilized in order to get said services off of the ground and running. In the meantime, we will continue to promote the Tobacco Quit Line at 1-800-QUIT-NOW (1-800-784-8669). There are online resources, including coaches who can utilize to help anyone who wants to stop smoking.

We don't want to ostracize anyone who does smoke. In the past, the approach that was taken in the grant was to engage with non-smokers in the process of promoting tobacco prevention but we also want to engage with those who do smoke. Our point is not to discriminate against anyone; we want everybody at the table when it comes to health issues like this. We need to see all sides of the community's story.

Lastly, we will make an effort to "beef" up information sharing and education utilizing multiple media streams to get the messages surrounding tobacco prevention and cessation out there (videos screened in the clinic lobbies, tribal newsletters, e-mails, Facebook, clinic newsletters, brochures & pamphlets, etc.).


#### Flu Shot Program for NESIKA Members

We are pleased to announce the availability of flu shots for a \$0 copay. Members can use the KPP prescription card to obtain a flu shot at all Kroger owned pharmacies at any time that is convenient for you. Locally, that includes Fred Meyer and QFC, however there are several Kroger owned pharmacies in other states. These include: Kroger, Ralphs, Smiths, Frys, King Soopers, City Market, Bakers, Dillions, Gerbes, Harris Teeter, and Scotts. Be sure to present your KPP ID card to the Kroger pharmacy and they will process the prescription and administer the flu shot. This benefit is available October 1st thru January 31, 2015.

#### **FLU FACTS**

Influenza is a serious disease that can lead to hospitalization and sometimes even death. Every flu season is different, and influenza infection can affect people differently. Even healthy people can get very sick from the flu and spread it to others. During flu season, flu viruses are circulating at higher levels in the U.S. population. An annual seasonal flu vaccine is the best way to reduce the chances that you will get seasonal flu and spread it to others. When more people get vaccinated against the flu, less flu can spread through that community. Flu vaccines cause antibodies to develop in the body about two weeks after vaccination. These antibodies provide protection against infection with the viruses that are in the

vaccine. Everyone 6
months of age and older
should get a flu shot. It is a
myth that you can get the
flu from the flu vaccine!

#### **NOVEMBER MAMMOGRAMS AT THE SOUTH CLINIC**


