



Student Rental Assistance Open Enrollment 2014-2015 School Year

The Student Rental Assistance Program has been accepting applications since July, 2014 for the upcoming school year. This program is designed to assist low to moderate income level Tribal Members who are attending school full time at an accredited college, university, or technical school with a monthly rental stipend. Applications must be filled out in their entirety and all requested documentation must be provided to be considered for this program. Applicants that do not provide all required documents will not be considered. This program is funded with federal grant money and applicants need to meet low income guidelines for eligibility. Applicants cannot pay more than 30% of their annual income for housing and must have a signed landlord information sheet to be eligible.

Please contact Sarah Briggs Resident Manager to request an application to apply for the program. Applications are also available online for download at www.cowcreek.com. If you are a continuing student, an application must be resubmitted and all requirements need to be met prior to receiving continued assistance. Funding is limited for this program; therefore, applications must be received in a timely manner to be reviewed. New Agreements Promote Increased Healthcare Access for Veterans

The Veterans Administration Roseburg Healthcare System and the Cow Creek Health and Wellness Center recently entered into a cooperative direct healthcare services agreement. The agreement allows the Cow Creek Health and Wellness Center to be reimbursed by the VA for enrolled and eligible tribal veterans (American Indian and Alaskan Native-Al/AN) who seek healthcare at the Health and Wellness Center.

Enrolled and eligible veterans who are AI/AN have always been able to seek healthcare at either facility. However, reimbursement allows the tribal clinic to offer additional services due to increased revenue and those services, in turn, are available to tribal veterans. Ultimately, the partnership increases access to veterans and increases the number of providers available to see veterans. According to Terry Bentley, VA Tribal Government Relations Specialist/Western Region, "These agreements effectively leverage the strengths of Tribal Health Programs and VA to enhance the delivery of care to Native American Veterans."

The Cow Creek Health and Wellness Center is the 39th tribal clinic in the Western Region (OR, WA, ID, NV, CA, AK) to sign a cooperative direct health care services agreement with the VA. Other tribes in Oregon to have signed a healthcare agreement with the VA are the Confederated Tribes of the Grand Ronde and the Confederated Tribes of the Umatilla.

The VA and Indian Health Services (IHS) signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) on October 1, 2010. This MOU addressed the promotion of quality healthcare as well as enhanced coordination and collaboration between the two agencies. One goal included was to "increase availability of services, in accordance with the law," by the development and payment and reimbursement policies and mechanisms to support care to eligible American Indian/Alaska Native Veterans served at the VA and IHS. During March-May of 2012, a draft national agreement was distributed for tribal review.

A strategy change occurred in June 2012 when the Dept. of Justice provided guidance that VA's Title 38 authorities allowed VAMCs to make agreements with Tribal Health Programs. So, the program changed from one national agreement to one in which a national agreement would apply to IHS facilities while local reimbursement agreements could be developed between VAMC and Tribal Health Programs (THP). On December 5, 2012, the VA-IHS National Agreement was signed after many months of negotiation. The first THP agreements were signed in May, 2012 for the Alaska VA THPS.

Sharon Stanphill, Health Director at the Cow Creek Health and Wellness Center, says, "Not many tribes are fortunate enough to live in a community with such a strong VA. This agreement will allow us to work more closely with one another as we coordinate services and provide high quality care to the tribal veterans we both serve."


Term/quarter students need to have the Scholarship Applications submitted to the Education Department by August 30th so that they are funded on time for the upcoming fall term.

The Wellness Center is partnering with Hometown Drugs to be the Cow Creek Tribal Pharmacy. <u>Every patient that is</u> <u>seen in our Clinic is eligible to use the Pharmacy</u>. If you have no prescription coverage you could save an average of 50% of the cost of the prescription. If you have Insurance, the savings will be passed onto the Tribal Health Program.

Frequently Asked Questions RE: Prescriptions...

I do not currently use Hometown Drugs, how do I transfer my prescriptions to them? *Call Hometown Drugs and they will do that for you.*

If I have Insurance, can I use Hometown Drugs? Yes. Your co-pay would stay the same and the savings would be passed onto the Tribal Health Program.

If my Doctor writes a prescription for 90 days, will the Pharmacy fill it for 90 days? Yes. CCH&WC has negotiated a contract with Nesika Insurance. If you do not have Nesika, please check with your insurance company.

Can I bring in a prescription from a Provider that is not at Cow Creek Health & Wellness Center? *If a Provider from CCH&WC refers* you out to another Provider and that Provider writes you a prescription, then yes you can.

Could I do mail order or delivery? Yes. Hometown Drugs offers mail order and Local Delivery to our clinics for those with transportation issues.

Purchase and Referred Care (PRC) formerly Contract Health Services (CHS)

If you have PRC, please notify the staff at the Pharmacy so they can work with PRC Services.

Due to the significant savings of using our Tribal Pharmacy, we encourage Tribal Members to use Hometown Drugs, which will allow the savings to come back to your Cow Creek Tribe.

Cow Creek tribe re-creates winter housing

A replica of a Cow Creek Umpqua Tribe plank house, made of cedar logs, was recently dedicated at the Pioneer-Indian Museum.

Tribe members and Don Day, a member of the Confederated Tribes of Grand Ronde, built the 10-by-12-foot house with wooden tools, including hammers and wedges. The tools are on display at the museum.

"It was very hard work," Cow Creek CEO Michael Rondeau said. "That was a great experience for our tribal members to acquire those skills, keep them alive."

The tribe donated the house, which Rondeau estimated cost more than \$5,000 to build.

"Our partnership with the museum is important because we want to make sure the public stays educated about the first Oregonians," Rondeau said.

The house replicates housing typically used in the winter.

"It was kind of important to have that representation of our tribe," said Rhonda Malone, who has worked for the tribe for 22 years and is a tribe liaison on the museum's board.

Tribal members began construction in September 2013.

The logs were split and cut to size on tribal land before they were brought to the museum and assembled.

The entrance is a small, oval opening that faces east to catch the morning sun.

"We wanted to have something outside and incorporate Indian culture," said Susan Waddle, a volunteer for 14 years at the museum.

Seven Feathers Casino Resort provided refreshments at the dedication. Traditional drumming was performed by tribe members. There's no charge to visit the museum.





Cow Creek Health & Wellness Center - Frequently Asked Questions

How we see our patients at the clinics has changed as we have grown and are much busier. Please see the frequently asked questions below to optimize your access to care.

- How do I establish care with the CCH&WC? All new patients to the CCH&WC must complete a New Patient Registration packet and return it prior to being seen.
- Can I call and get an appointment in the same day? Yes, each day there are several spots left open for each of our medical providers for those patients who are ill. These appointments are on a first-come-first-served basis and are usually filled by 10:00 am. A waiting list will be kept each day and if anyone cancels their appointment you will be called to come in. The waiting list does not carry over to the next day, so if you are still ill (and are still in need of an appointment) please begin calling us at 8:00 am for any open same day appointments. Please don't leave a message on the clinic voicemail as appointments are only made via a "live" scheduler.
- <u>Does the CCH&WC have "Walk-In" hours?</u> No, we no longer can accommodate "Walk-ins". The clinic has become busier than when we first opened our 2nd clinic in May 2013, therefore, we ask you to call first before you drive to the clinic or walk down from the casino so we can assure you can be seen; calling right at 8:00 am is best as the appointments fill up fast. We can fax or email you forms to complete if you have not been seen in the past 12 months for any updated information. This will save you time prior to arriving for your appointment.

TRIBAL KIUYUM-ID

Jack Jerry Ansures (Tooter) August 21,1934-July 29, 2014



Jack was born August 21, 1934 in Roseburg, Oregon. Tooter crossed over to the Spirit world Tuesday, July 29, 2014. He was raised by his Uncle Louis Thomason and wife Nellie in Drew, OR. He attended Drew and Days Creek Schools. He started working in the logging industry when he was 15. He was an Elder of the Cow Creek Band of the Umpqua Indian Tribe. He worked for the tribe as a site monitor, working with the BLM, Forest Service, ODOT, and many archaeologists in the local area.

Tooter is survived by his daughter, Teri Hansen; son, Del Ansures; grandsons, Jacob Ansures (Brittney), Drew Ansures, and Josh Ansures (Beth); granddaughters, Crystal Ansures, Heather Vick (Aaron), and numerous great-grandchildren. He is also survived by his soulmate Alice Williams. He leaves a network of cousins, nieces, nephews, extended family and friends.

Tooter was a supporter of AA, recently achieving his 33 year chip. He sponsored and encouraged many people in the program. He was proud of the tribal AA group (Recovery on Turtle Island) started by his daughter Teri.

His devotion to his heritage was ongoing throughout the years of his life. He testified before Congress to gain recognition for the tribe. He was instrumental in supporting the tribal pow wow at South Umpqua Falls. He was an advocate for cultural activities and supported education and employment of tribal members.

His "Tooter Tours" of the local back country, sense of humor, and storytelling will be missed among the younger generations of the tribe. We shall forever honor this man and all he stood for. He will be buried in the Thomason Cemetery near Drew, OR. An informal Celebration of his life will be held on Saturday, August 23rd from 1:00-5:00 PM at Seven Feathers in the Convention Center rooms B & C.
