

From the Chairman's Desk



Oregon's Legislative Commission on Indian Services marked its 40th Anniversary on Thursday, May 14th. The state's top legislators and tribal representatives gathered at the capitol to celebrate. The Legislative Commission on Indian Services was created by statute in 1975 to improve services to Native Americans in Oregon. There are 13 members – nine Tribal and two each from the Oregon House and Senate. All proposed state legislation is filtered through the commission so that Tribes can provide input when necessary. Oregon is one of the few states that recognize Tribal sovereignty.

The first proclamation by the Governor honored the 40th anniversary of the Legislative Commission on Indian Services. Governor Brown said "Today, we celebrate 40 years of this national model of government-to-government; a model that strives to make this place we call Oregon a better place for the next seven generations. LCIS has worked to ensure Oregon honors and preserves the rich heritage and culture of our Tribes." The ceremony consisted of a Tribal flag procession through the rotunda where each of the nine tribes presented their flags. A Color Guard, Drummers, Veterans and speeches from Secretary of State Jeanne Atkins, Oregon Senate President Peter Courtney and Speaker of the House Tina Kotek were featured as well.

Improving Patient Care (IPC) Initiative Results in Cow Creek Health & Wellness Center Receiving a National and Regional Award

The Cow Creek Health and Wellness Center (CCHWC) has been participating in the Indian Health Service's national Improving Patient Care (IPC) initiative since the summer of 2013. The two year effort has been successful, resulting in better patient healthcare, and in the CCHWC receiving two awards.

On Friday, May 29, 2015, Dr. Sharon Stanphill, Director of the CCHWC, traveled to the National Institute of Health in Bethesda, Maryland, to accept the first of the two awards, the highest award given by the Indian Health Service (IHS), the Directors Award. In accepting the award, Dr. Stanphill said, "We truly believe our first priority is getting patients and their families the care they need when they need it. Our staff is extremely dedicated to assuring the medical care provided to patients is of the highest standard. We also make sure patients are actively participating in their healthcare decisions."

On June 19, in Portland, Oregon, a second award that recognizes the CCHWC's IPC achievements will be presented by the Portland Area Indian Health Services at their Recognition of Excellence Ceremony. When asked about the award, Dean Seyler, Portland Area Indian Health Services Director, said, "I am honored to recognize the Cow Creek Health & Wellness Center's contributions to the mission of Indian Health Services and their exemplary effort to elevate the health status of American Indian and Alaska Native communities."

In a survey about what IPC brought to treatment, patients commented positively. Changes had been noticed and patients made comments about them: the formation of medical home teams; being assigned to their provider of choice; ease of making an appointment; reduced wait times; the addition of services such as radiology, and the expansion of behavioral health services. The survey provided patients with an opportunity to make suggestions about additional changes. Those suggestions where possible have been incorporated into the CCHWC's procedures.

The Cow Creek Health & Wellness Center delivers healthcare on two campuses: one located in Roseburg, Oregon (north campus) and the other twenty-seven miles south in Canyonville, Oregon (south campus). Today, the CCH&WC employs fifty healthcare staff between the two campuses. The medical clinic has been serving Tribal Members and their families as well as employees and their families since April of 2000.

With the Cow Creek Umpqua Tribal Board making healthcare a top priority, the Cow Creek Health & Wellness Center is one of the fastest growing medical clinics in the Pacific Northwest.


Where's the Beef?

2015 Firewood Program

It is hard to believe we are already into spring with summer just around the corner. It's time to place your firewood order for winter. We have a nice mix of hardwoods for high heat output, with a bit of fir and cedar thrown in to get that hot fire started.

There has been a change in where firewood orders will be picked up. The firewood center has been moved to the Tribal Garden.

The firewood pickup procedure is as follows:

- ♦ All firewood orders must be paid prior issuing a Firewood Permit.
- All firewood orders must be paid with a check or money order.
- ◆ To place a firewood order please contact Janet Cooper at (541) 677-5575 or icooper@cowcreek.com.
- Firewood will not be issued without the permit.
- The maximum order is 2 cords of firewood per Tribal household.
- Firewood cost is \$50/cord. Tribal Elders get their first cord free.
- Firewood will no longer be stacked in cords. There will be instructions at the Tribal Garden regarding how much firewood is in a cord. Tribal Garden staff will also help with this.
- Firewood will be ready for pick-up at the Tribal Garden in Canyonville in the beginning of August.
- The Tribal Garden will be opening its gates officially on June 8, 2015. The hours of operation will be Monday Friday (8:30 4:30). Once we have more produce available these hours will be adjusted to provide more harvest opportunities.
- There will no longer be a need to call and schedule an appointment to pick up firewood orders as the Tribal Garden staff will be available during the hours of operation at the Tribal Garden.
- Firewood orders must be picked up in at least ½ cord loads.

The procedures listed below have not changed:

As a reminder, you are responsible for loading and hauling your own firewood. Firewood from the Tribal Firewood Program is for personal use only, and is not to be re-sold.

There is a limited firewood supply each year. Permits will be issued in the order in which firewood orders are placed. Thank you.

Lamprey Harvest Permits Available



Are You Interested in Harvesting Lamprey at Willamette Falls?

The Pacific lamprey season at Willamette Falls is from June 1st-July 31st 2015. In order to harvest lamprey, each Tribal member must have in their possession their Tribal identification card, a harvest permit, and must record their daily catch on a harvest record card. The Cow Creek Housing Program is accepting applications for the Tribes Low Income Rental homes. This program is federally funded through the Housing and Urban Development (HUD), Indian Housing Block Grant and is administered by the Tribe.

This program can assist eligible Tribal members whom are willing to reside in one of the Tribes low-income rental units. Priority is given to families with the greatest needs in relation to income, family size, age, disabilities, etc.

We are almost at the end of our waiting list and wait list will be less than it has been in previous years.

Reminder

If you are currently on the waiting list for a house please make sure that your address and phone number are up to date. If your name is coming up on the list and we cannot get ahold of you, we will be forced to pass you by until we hear from you. Also remember that if you are on the waiting list your application needs to be updated on a biannual basis.
