



Tribal Hunting News

The Tribe continues to exercise a right that they have always had, hunting on their Tribal lands and providing meat for Tribal gatherings and elders. Currently with a healthy elk population migrating across Tribal lands, the Tribal hunting program was able to offer Tribal members with more hunting opportunities this year by increasing the amount of elk tags available. Over a 100 applicants applied for either elk or black-tail deer tags in 2015 and all successful applicants have been notified.

In 2014, many hunters were able to fill their tag and made great memories with family members. Hunting is not only culturally important to Tribal members, but it also brings family members back together again.

Tribal wildlife specialist, Scott Van Norman, who manages the hunting program says, "One thing I have noticed with our hunting program, not only does it give Tribal members hunting opportunity, it also can re-connect family members that have not seen each other or hunted together since they were young."

During these hunts, Tribal members have helped each other by sharing knowledge, hunting experience, or just helping in the harvest process of skinning and transporting the animal. Scott also mentions, "I get to meet some great people, and most of them have been raised by hunting and fishing families, so it's nice to see the tradition continue. It is also nice to see the excitement in the first time hunter who's never harvested an elk or deer before." Cucumber and Tomato Salad



Sun ripened tomatoes and crunchy cucumbers come together to make a refreshing summer salad to go with any meal. Tomatoes and cucumbers should be easy to find at your local garden or farmers market this August!

Serves 6

2 large cucumbers, halved lengthwise and sliced (I like to leave the peel on)

3 large tomatoes, seeded and chopped

2/3 cup chopped red onion or green onion

½ cup chopped fresh basil

1/3 cup red wine vinegar

3 TB olive oil

1 TB sugar

1 tsp salt

½ tsp black pepper

Directions

- In large bowl toss together the cucumbers, tomatoes, onions, and basil.
- In a small bowl, whisk together vinegar, oil, sugar, salt and pepper.
- Pour dressing over salad and toss to coat. Let set for at least 1 hour in the fridge to allow the flavors to marinate.

Notes:

- -You could use lemon juice instead of red wine vinegar.
- -Try adding feta cheese and Kalamata or black olives to the salad.
- -Instead of basil you could add ¼ cup of chopped fresh mint.

Nutrition per 1 cup: 88 calories, 7g fat, 6g carbohydrate, 77mg sodium, 0g protein, 1g fiber.

Be ready for fall: Take a hunter education class this summer



Keep the kids occupied this summer and get them ready for fall hunting. Register them for a <u>hunter education class or field day</u> happening around the state in August and early September.

ODFW offers two types of hunter education classes: a traditional classroom experience or independent study, which kids can do from home via workbook or <u>online course</u>. Independent study students also need to attend a field day to receive their hunter education certificate. Both types of class about 12 hours to complete.

For a list of current classes and field days open in Oregon, visit the <u>ODFW's license sales site</u> and click View All Classes-Workshops / Hunter Ed Class or Hunter Ed Field Day tab. New classes are added regularly so check back if you don't see a date, time or location that works for you. Registering for a class or field day costs \$10.

Independent study students can take one of three online courses (fees range from \$13 to \$24.50 and include mobile-friendly options) or request a free workbook by emailing odfw.info@state.or.us. These students must also sign up for and complete a field day, where they practice safe firearm handling and shooting with certified hunter education instructors.

Adults are also welcome to attend any hunter education classes and may take the <u>adult online course</u>, which doesn't require a field day for certification.

Hunter education is required for all hunters under the age of 18 and encouraged for adults, too. The classes cover important issues including hunter ethics and respect for private landowners; wildlife management and identification; firearms handling and safety; hunt preparation and techniques; survival; and introductory bow hunting.

Student Rental Assistance 2015-2016 School Year

The Student Rental Assistance Program will be accepting application beginning July 15, 2015 for the upcoming school year. This program is designed to assist low to moderate income level Tribal Members who are attending school full time at an accredited college, university, or technical school with a monthly rental stipend. Applications must be filled out in their entirety and all requested documentation must be provided to be considered for this



program. Applicants that do not provide all required documents will not be considered. This program is funded with federal grant money and applicants need to meet low income guidelines for eligibility. Applicants cannot pay more than 30% of their annual income and must have a signed landlord information sheet to be eligible.

Please contact Sarah Briggs Resident Manager to request an application to apply for the program. Applications are also available online for download at www.cowcreek.com. If you are a continuing student an application must be re-submitted and all

requirements need to be met prior to receiving continued assistance. Funding is limited for this program therefore applications must be received in a timely manner to be reviewed.
