## **Lamprey Harvest Permits**

The Oregon Fish and Wildlife Commission recently approved the issuance of permits to tribal governments authorizing harvest of Lamprey at Willamette Falls by members of a federally recognized tribe for personal use only. The Commission has also recently adopted statewide regulations prohibiting the use of lamprey for bait in all recreational and commercial fisheries.

Personal use lamprey harvest (meaning no harvest for commercial sales) is restricted to the hours of 7:00 am to 6:00 pm, Saturday through Monday, between June 1, and July 21, 2005. The open fishing area is at the eastside of the falls, and the harvest method is limited to the use of hand or hand-powered tools and a limit of 100

lampreys per permit holder.

All harvesters are required to record their lamprey harvest on a daily basis on an Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife issued harvest record card, which can be obtained at the Cow Creek Tribal Government Offices or by contacting the Clackamas office of the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife at 17330 SE Evelyn Street, Clackamas, OR 97015 or by telephone (503) 657-2000. Your tribal identification card will act as your 2005 permit.

# Nesika Health Group Program Changes

The Nesika Health Group has made changes to the pharmacy program. Nesika is now affiliated with Kroger Prescription Plans, located in Portland, Oregon. Kroger will be replacing Pequot (PRXN/Caremark) as the pharmacy network.

Members of the Health Plan will be receiving a letter and new Nesika ID cards in the mail. (The current pharmacy card may still be used until the new one has been received or until May 31, 2005. However, Kroger must be used for prescriptions on or after June 1, 2005.)

All benefits and co-pays remain the same. The major change is in the mail order portion of the program. There are now two different ways to access the mail order. The first is <u>Postal Prescription Services</u> to receive your 90 day supply (the prescriptions is mailed to the home address) or the alternative of <u>Option 90</u>.

Kroger Prescription Plans offer a special feature called <u>Option 90</u>, which allows members to fill the mail order prescription (90 day supply) at the mail order cost at a local Kroger Pharmacy such as Fred Meyer or QFC. Members will receive the same mail order benefit even though the prescription will be filled at the local Kroger Pharmacy.

To locate the nearest participating pharmacy, call (800) 957-6437 or go to the website "MedImpact", click pharmacy locator, put in your ID number and a zip code, it will locate the nearest participating pharmacy.

Members will now have two ID cards. One card is for pharmacy benefits and the other card is for medical, dental and vision benefits.

#### TRIBAL IDENTIFICATION CARDS

Tribal Identification Cards are available to all tribal members upon request. To obtain an I.D. card, contact Carol Ferguson at the Cow Creek Government Offices at 1-800-929-8229. You will be sent an application which you should fill out and sign. Enclose a photo and mail the material back to the Tribal Govern-

ment Offices for processing.

Properly filled out applications will be processed with the Tribal Chairman's signature and mailed back to you.
