### ADULT VOCATIONAL TRAINING PROGRAM

The Adult Vocational Training Program Is currently planning to assist six tribal members in various fields of study. The areas of training are bookkeeping, computer software, diesel mechanics, business information processing, auto mechanics and accounting technology.

If you, or any tribal member you may know, is interested in attending a training institution to obtain a vocational skill, please contact the tribal Office to set up an appointment to meet with the AVT Coordinator and discuss your situation. Please keep in mind that the Adult Vocational Training Program is mandated by the Bureau of Indian Affairs regulations to the the seven county service area. As a reminder, these counties are; Coos, Deschutes, Douglas, Jackson, Josephine, Klamath, and Lane.

#### HIGHER EDUCATION PROGRAM

The Higher Education Program is now being administered in our office, giving us more flexibility in meeting the educational needs of our students.

We currently have 11 students, with about 5 more in the process of gathering application information, and will be enrolled soon.

Unlike the Adult Vocational Training Program, the Higher Education Program has no service area restrictions.

Scholarship information is available in the office for high school seniors for the Oregonian Scholarship, which administers grants for up to \$10,000.00 per eligible student. These grants are awarded on the basis of need and merit. Applications are available through high school counselors throughout Oregon after November 15th, with the deadline for submission of this application being March 15, 1990.

#### TRIBAL FOSTER HOMES NEEDED

Along with Gene Gentry from the Klamath Tribe and Muriel Brainard from the Confederated Tribes of the Coos, Lower Umpqua and Siuslaw, we have been meeting regularly with representatives of the Southern Region of Children's Services Division in dealing with issues concerning the welfare of Indian children.

When Indian children are unable to live with their parents and they come to the attention of our Child Protection Team or Children's Services Division, we make every effort to reunite the children with their family. If that is not possible an attempt is made to place them with relatives. If a home with relatives cannot be found, the children are placed in foster care. The preference of both the Tribe and CSD is an Indian foster home. Unfortunately there is a severe shortage of Indian foster homes.

### GENERAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

On October 1, 1989 the Bureau of Indian Affairs will start a General Assistance Program for eligible Native Americans. To receive this help, a person must live on or near a Reservation or Service Area in Oregon.

The General Assistance Program will provide money for those who are not receiving Public Assistance. The money is a limited amount for basic living needs. This program is intended to promote self-sufficiency.
