ADULT EDUCATION PROGRAM

Assistance is available for the cost of G.E.D. testing. Classes are held weekly at U.C.C.'s Wooley Center in Roseburg. For more details, call the Adult Education Dept.

Project Literacy, Umpqua Region, offers trained, volunteer tutors matched with interested learners who lack basic skills needed to complete high school requirements, read the news paper, fill out job applications, and other basic life skills necessary to survive. The Contract Health Services Program will begin on Monday, August 5. In order to be eligible for contract health care you must:

1. Be an enrolled member of the Tribe.
2. Live within the seven county service area.
3. Pre-authorize all services.
4. Use alternate resources when available.
