PROJECT LITERACY UMPQUA REGION

A joint effort between the Tribal Education Programs and the Umpqua Region of Project Literacy is being undertaken to address the basic educational needs of tribal and other community members in the Canyonville area.

A tutor has been retained on a voluntary basis to help with basic education skills. The class will tentatively meet at the Canyonville Bible Academy on Tuesday and Thursday evenings from 7 to 9 p.m.

This program is designed to meet the needs of a variety of people. First it will help those who have not received a high school diploma to obtain a GED. It also will help those, including entire families, who wish to work on basic education and literacy skills.

This program is intended to help children and adults, in a non-threatening classroom setting. Tutoring will be tailored to each persons capability, with enphasis on individual attention. Students will be allowed to work at their own pace.

Volunteers to assist tutors are still needed for this program. Anyone who volunteers as a tutor will receive training in the Laubach method of tutoring from Project Literacy Personnel.
