SHAFFER AND YEUST FAVORITES

IN TRIBAL BOARD OF DIRECTORS ELECTION

The annual election for the Tribal Board of Directors was held on August 9, 1992, in the Administrative Offices.

The two four year positions opened by the staggered term of office established in the Tribe's Constitution, ratified July 8, 1991, were filled by incumbents Sue M. Shaffer and Dorothy Yeust.

Shaffer and Yeust were also elected by the Board of Directors to serve as Chairman and Treasurer, respectively. Vice Chairman Wallace Rondeau and Secretary Carla Swanson retained their offices.

Shaffer has served on the Board since 1975, and has served as Chairman since 1984. Yeust has served on the Board since 1984 and in the position of Treasurer since 1990.

Their goals are to strengthen and expand on economic development project and initiate a health care plan that will benefit tribal members and their families, who are otherwise not covered.

HOUSING IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM

The Tribal Office will be conducting a Housing Improvement Survey to be completed by May of 1993. This survey is extremely important in determining the yearly funding level of our tribe. The more houses recorded in our survey, the greater possibility that our funding level will increase. You will be contacted regarding this survey. Your participation will be greatly appreciated.

SEARCHING FOR EMPLOYMENT

Many people are coming in to view the jobs board. There are a variety of jobs available. Some of the current listings include general laborer, janitorial, auto painter helper, green chain puller, highway engineer, supervisory forester, civil engineer and alcohol and substance abuse prevention officer.

We receive listings from the Bureau of Indian Affairs, however, these generally require relocation to another city or state.

We also receive a current job list from the State of Oregon on a weekly basis for jobs in the Roseburg area. Listed are: mill work, secretarial, cooks, dishwashers, waitressing,

COW CREEK INDIAN BINGO CENTER

The Bingo Center has been open now for nearly four months. Start up expenses were tremendous, however the income has been adequate to meet these costs and the loan responsibility.

All tribal members who applied in April of this year for jobs at the Bingo Center were hired, with the exception of three. Two opted for other employment and the third did not meet the application criteria.

Although at the present time there are no job openings, applications for possible future employment may be obtained after 3 p.m. on Mon., Thurs., Fri. and Sat., and after 11 a.m. on Sunday.

Qualified tribal members will be given first preference for any job opportunity.

TUTORING

School will be starting soon. Now is the time to gather all available people who would be willing to volunteer to tutor our Tribal Children as the need arises. Tutoring is done on a weekly basis for 2 hours per week. The time, day and meeting place will be left up to the tutor and the student. Tutor training will be provided through Project Literacy.
