NOMINATIONS/ELECTION ALERT

At the regular quarterly meeting of the General Council on May 16, 1993 the following people were duly nominated and their names will appear on the ballot in this order:

Four positions are open for the Board of Directors. Registered tribal voters may vote for up to four of the above persons. If you mark more than four on your ballot the Election Board will void the ballot.

Once again the Bureau of Indian Affairs, Siletz Agency, will be conducting the election. Ballots will be mailed to the 373 people who are registered to vote. These ballots will be mailed by the agency on July 2, 1993. In order for the vote to be counted, the ballot must be received back at the agency by (no later than) Friday, August 6, 1993. The official date of the election is August 8, 1993 and on that date the Election Board will convene in the Conference Room of the Tribal Office, 2400 Stewart Parkway, Suite 300, Roseburg, Oregon, to open the ballots and tally the count. This will be done under the direction of Mr. Dave Bartels, who will not serve on the Election Board but will be present for oversight. Election results will be announced at the General Council meeting at the IWA Hall, August 8, 1993.

THE ABOVE ALERT ON REGISTRATION/NOMINATIONS CONSTITUTE THE FORMAL NOTICE AS PROVIDED FOR IN THE TRIBAL ELECTION ORDINANCE WHICH WAS DEVELOPED IN COMPLIANCE WITH THE TRIBAL CONSTITUTION AND REQUIRES AT LEAST A 30 DAY NOTICE.

When you receive your ballot, mark it right away and mail it back. That way you will be sure that your vote gets counted.
