Board of Directors Schedules Out-OfState Meetings

For quite some time, the Board of Directors has been planning to get some meetings scheduled out of the area at various places where several families live. They felt it important to be able to furnish information, firsthand, to tribal members, to answer questions, etc.

The first such meeting will be:

Friday, Dec. 8th at 7:00p.m. at the Community Meeting Room of the Admin. Office of the Woodland School Dist., 800 3rd St., Woodland, Wash. Directions are as follows:

Take Woodland exit #21 off I-5.(Coming from North or South)

From South: Turn L. at stop light, go under freeway, straight through light on other side. (Road curves L), You will now be on Goerig St.

From North: Follow exit road parallel to I-5. When you come to Y in the road (where you can re-enter freeway) stay to the right. Go straight at stop sign. (You will now be on Goerig St.) Follow Goerig St. to Bozarth St.(U.S. Bank on corner) Turn R on Bozarth. Go 3 blocks. Turn R on 3rd. St. 3rd. St. ends at the School District Adm. Office. The Community meeting Room is the first room on the right.

The second meeting will be:

Saturday, Dec. 9th at 1:00 p.m. in the Heritage Room of the Red Lion, 221 N. Lincoln, Port Angeles, Wash.

This will be the regular monthly Board of Directors meeting. It is important that all tribal members living in these two areas attend the meetings. At a later time, the Board will hold meetings, (not yet scheduled), in other places.

Tribal Disbursement Plan Update

The Disbursement Plan, now tribal law, which has been approved by the Board of Directors, has been submitted to the Bureau of Indian Affairs for approval. A great deal of time and effort has been expended in the preparation of this document. Trust accounts are being set up for enrolled tribal members under the age of 18. The BIA has 90 days to approve what has been submitted, if they do not respond during that period of time the plan, as presented, goes into effect and the disbursement can begin.

If approval comes from the BIA before the deadline, disbursement will begin within 15 days. Please make sure your address is correct at the Tribal office in order to receive your disbursement check when the plan is approved.

Tribal Office Phones

The Cow Creek Tribal Office has been experiencing trouble with the phone lines for several weeks.

The Contract Health computer line has been out of order quite frequently due to the line problems.

On Sept. 27, 1995, U.S. West Communications finished installing the new cables on the NW side of Roseburg. This should eliminate any further interruptions in phone service.

Johnson O'Malley Program (JOM)

Indian students from age 3-18 or grade 12, who are either an enrolled member of a federally recognized tribe or can prove 1/4% Indian decendency are eligible for JOM.

JOM serves program enrolled members from Jackson, Josephine and Douglas counties. JOM offers tutoring, cultural awareness through presentation, craft classes, liaison and referral services and various other activities.

The JOM youth currently meets the third Sunday of every month at the Canyonville Youth Center, next to the Jr. High.

Our next meeting day will be Sunday, <u>December 17</u>, 1995, from 2-4 p.m. WILDLIFE IMAGES WILL BE DOING A PRESENTATION, weather permitting.
