Hotel Preview for Tribal Members

On Wednesday, July 31st at 6:00pm, there is a special opportunity for Tribal members to come and enjoy a fine buffet and free lodging in the new tribally owned "7 Feathers Hotel" next to the gaming center. Tribal members who wish to stay free of charge in the hotel on the night of July 31st must make a reservation for their room. Reservations are to be taken on a "first-come, first-served" basis.

So that everyone will have an equal opportunity, reservations will be taken no earlier than 9:00am Pacific time on Wed., July 17th and no later than 4:00pm on Wed., July 24th.

There are 153 rooms available. In the event that you do not make a reservation for a room but wish to come to the opening celebration and buffet, you are welcome. If there are any vacant rooms remaining, you may have a room, however, everyone is urged to make a reservation as early as possible so that planning can be completed. Reservations are limited to Tribal members and their families only. It is imperative when making your reservation that you state the number of adults and ages of all children. This information is necessary for both the room and the buffet.

TRIBAL PROGRAMS

Housing Assistance

The Cow Creek Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) Housing Improvement Program (HIP) is currently accepting applications for housing assistance. This program can assist eligible tribal members who are currently living in the seven county service area with housing needs such as: rehabilitation (roof, weatherization, windows, doors, structural repairs, etc.) or down payment assistance. Priority is given to families with the greatest need in relation to income, family size, etc.

Child Care Assistance

The Cow Creek Child Care Assistance Program is provided through the Child Care and Development Block Grant and can provide assistance for full-time child care, and/or after school child care for eligible families.

All applicants must live in the seven county service area and be employed, engaged in an onthe-job training program, or enrolled in school. The children must be under the age of 13.

Job Opening

GAMING INSPECTOR:

Regulate and monitor all Duties include: gaming activities at the gaming center. Ensure compliance with Tribal Gaming Commission rules and regulation, Tribal State Compact, Indian Gaming Regulatory Act, Rules and regulations of the National Indian Gaming Regulatory Commission. Liaison with local, state and federal gaming regulators and law enforcement personnel. Conduct investigation when allegation of gaming related misconduct arises. Monitor electronic and table gaming to ensure compliance with procedures in the conduct of those games, as specified by the Gaming Commission. Investigate player disputes related to gaming. Other duties as may be assigned from time to time by the Gaming Commission. Report directly to the Tribal Gaming Commission.

Qualifications: Applicants must be able to pass an extensive background investigation, as well as a drug test. Preferred applicants will hold at least a high school diploma or GED, have the ability to interpret rules and regulations and apply them to appropriate situations. Must also have good communication skills, both spoken and written, be able to prepare detailed written reports, be available to attend training and seminars out of the area.

Investigation experience and/or gaming experience are preferred but not required.
